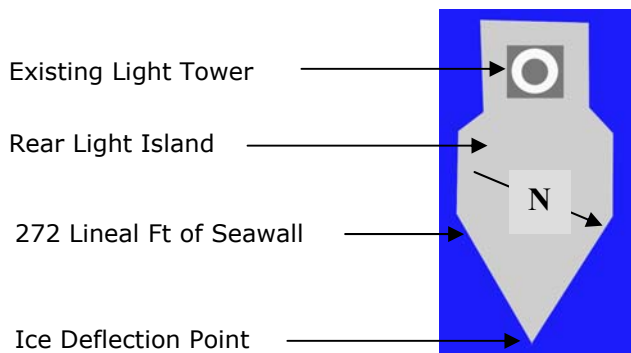
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Thankfully, we are seeing some real progress at the rear range lighthouse.

After receiving our grant(s) and taking bids on the major work to be done, we didn't have enough to do both lights so we decided that we would try to completely renovate the rear light and protect the tower with a new seawall.

The island the tower occupies is somewhat shaped like an "arrow head" and the old seawall is approximately 272 lineal feet long.

We surmise that the pointed shape toward Muscamoot Bay was to deflect the ice coming out of the bay in the spring.



The seawall was a major part of the cost approaching \$1,000 per foot. The huge heavy 30-ft. sheets, driven 20-ft into the lake bottom must stand up to the heavy relentless wave action in the open lake along with the tremendous pressure of ice movement in the winter.

All aspects of the renovation have been documented with digital photos both in close-up and overall view, some of which are included in this newsletter to give our members an overall look on the ongoing work.

Congratulations to all those who never wavered and worked hard over the years to make the saving of the range lights a reality.

We still have a long road ahead, but with the ongoing help of our officers and membership we can not fail.

Mark Mckee what retired from the treasurers' position recently is much more than an officer of our organization; he is a friend and mentor.

Happily, he has consented to stay on as a member of our board. I can't say enough about this man's dedication and willingness to struggle along with us during the lean years, the better times, and now again, the lean years to come.

Mark, former publisher of the Monitor Leader and Macomb Daily newspapers in Mount Clemens is a gifted historian in his own right and has been, and continues to be, one of Macomb Counties finest examples of an exemplary leader and citizen.
