

Happy 2016 everyone, and with the mild winter this year I look forward to an early start for our maintenance and restoration activities this year. I will start with a recap of the 2015 season.

We closed out all of the administrative tasks related to the Michigan State Historic Preservation Office grant funded project that was completed in late November of 2014.

We successfully navigated through the grant process, and received our reimbursement for all qualifying expenses. The initiative focused exclusively on the smaller front light. The scope of that project was to strip off the yellow paint that was added to the structure in the 1960s. Then every mortar seam was ground out, and all structural cracks were repaired using steel staples. Furthermore, all missing bricks were replaced. Finally the entire structure was freshly repointed. In addition, the interior of the tower was cross braced to prepare the tower to be lifted off of the base when we have the funding for a new foundation. The work was completed on November 7th, just in front of the onset of an early winter. The completion of that project is tangible progress toward the ultimate goal of straightening the light. This work will ensure that the structure will be stable while we continue to work toward the next phase.

The Michigan State Historic Preservation Office grant program has been vital for the large projects that SOSCL has completed over the years. This program is funded by the Michigan Lighthouse Assistance Program. You can help support the preservation of Michigan's lighthouses by purchasing a State of Michigan specialty license plate from the Secretary of State. To learn more about these special license plates, or to purchase one for your vehicle, please visit the "Lighthouse Preservation" page at the Secretary of State's website.

The SOSCL Organization has had some great contributions from Boy Scouts and their projects associated with the pursuit of the rank of Eagle Scout. First there was the cedar fence project for the rear light completed by Kathy Brady's son Jeramy Chrisman. Then there was the outhouse project accomplished by Brock Gabbert. Our latest endeavor is working with twin brothers David and Mathew Hannah. Their Eagle Scout project which was approved by the SOSCL Board, is to reconstruct the shed that once stood on a platform overhanging the water on the south side of the rear island. This is a very ambitious undertaking, and we have split the construction into two phases allowing both brothers the opportunity to complete their Eagle projects. The first phase was to weld a steel platform to support the shed. This was complete on November 23^{rd,} 2015. The next phase is the historically accurate construction of the shed, which is being prefabricated over the winter. The boys will transport the sections via barge to the island in early spring. We look forward to the completion of this project and it will be another accomplishment for our restoration goals.

We continue to work with Tom Schneider, the Curator of Birds at the Detroit Zoo. The island at the front light has become one of the few places in Michigan that the Common Tern successfully breeds. Actually Common Terns are not common at all, they are a rare and endangered bird. Over 100 nesting pairs were observed and tagged at the front light. The Zoo staff helps with weed control by applying a special herbicide in the fall. They plan on removing all the dead vegetation in the spring, before the birds arrive (around April 10th). They will also apply a pre-emergent herbicide at that time to keep weeds down this year. I will be working with Tom to add a weed resistant substrate in the fall as a long term solution to the weed problem on the front island.



Michigan Lighthouse Assistance Program

This year in addition to our normal maintenance activities, we plan to install a solar panel, battery and led light array in the lantern room, so that the light shines automatically for at least a portion of the boating season. We also need to paint some of the interior metal fixtures in the rear light. The cedar fence is in need of straightening, and we would like to bring in some additional fill dirt around the seawall where settling has occurred. We would also like to re-stain the fence. We have plenty of items on our to-do list and as soon as the ice leaves Lake St. Clair, my fantastic crew and I will be out there making progress again.
